Online Conference Tuesday am - 10th, 17th and 24th November

To celebrate the 30th Saint John of God Research Study Day, the Saint John of God Research Foundation will host a series of online conferences focusing on human rights and the centrality of the person in mental health and intellectual disability services. Throughout the online conferences future research challenges and priorities will be discussed.

The first of this series will shine a spotlight on the protection of human rights through the provision of mental health and intellectual disability services. Our expert speakers will discuss the ethical and legal framework under which care is provided; the personal perspective of receiving care; and the challenges encountered as we try to provide a service in the context of a changing environment.

Our second online conference will explore the impact of global events on wellbeing. Our expert speakers will discuss evidence of the impact of COVID-19 on mental health. The COVID-19 pandemic has had an unprecedented impact on the way in which mental health and intellectual disability services are received. Our speakers will look at the impact on adult, older-age adults, child and adolescent mental health and on the wellbeing of the men and women attending intellectual disability services.
